- Did not meet this month- Dawn unavailable
- Leah noted that under the Federal Revenue ESSR Funds- \$0 doesn't mean we haven't used those funds, they just haven't been formally moved over which Dawn will take care of
- Everything else is right on track for this time of the school year
- 6. Executive Director's Report Leah
 - Enrollment 201, budget at 206
 - Attendance is at 87.5%, goal is 85%
 - Teachers have started using both Wonders reading curriculum and new SEL curriculum
 - Team Smile- most students received free dental cleaning, education, and support. Will see them again in 6 months to continue the care with the goal that the need will be less as time goes on and education turns into home routines
 - Assessments have been completed and results of NWEA testing will be shared (those
 - Hispanic Heritage Month is wrapping up- creating a video of students since we cannot invite families into the building at this time
 - Kindness Campaign- October 26th 3rd- 6th grade girls. Will address things such as return to school/ social media/ bullying/ etc. Will be a virtual interactive event in the cafeteria.
 - Contacted Youth Frontiers as an additional support for all students
 - Still need a Special Education Coordinator, position is posted- need someone with experience
 - In house sub starts Oct 25 (MWF)
 - Continuing to look for a new cleaning company
 - Playground- spoke with the attorney today, a letter will be written to the landlord regarding the community playground grants and lack of maintenance and keeping it a "private" playground. Lawyer is prepared to send the letter next week and will progress as needed.
 - COVID update- 0 cased. Testing has improved- 41 new members enrolled in testing program. Now 75 students in testing program which tests every Monday morning. Also using rapid tests for staff and sent home with students as needed. Have had no quarantines needed, feeling positive with what is in place at the school
 - Camp St. Croix was a success
 - Halloween celebrations will still take place this year with some adjustments for COVID

- o COVID update
 - Discussed during Executive Director report
- o Review NWEA results
 - Christyna discussed what components are tested within the NWEA testing
 - NWEA-
 - K-2 did not take NWEA in the Spring of 202 and Fall of 2020 which means students currently in 3rd grade haven't since the NWEA test since 1st grade
 - 4-6 most accurate scores are from Fall 2021-2022 as not all students took it last year and testing times ranged from 9 min to 133 when it should take 40- 60 minutes
 - o Testing time and importance of test will be a focus to convey to students for January test
 - Discussed difficulty finding a baseline to compare results to given distance learning
 - Students in 4-6 who tested in both the spring of 2021 and fall of 2021 are showing consistency in results
 - Title Data- All students that tested red are being serviced daily by a Title teacher this year (122)
 - Dyslexia Screener- 59/93 students were flagged
 - Students scored highest in Listening Comprehension and Picture vocabulary
 - Students struggle with phonological awareness and phonics/word recognition
 - Next test will be in January
 - Hoping flaws of test itself will be sorted out to provide more accurate data
 - Discussed Learning Loss from 2020/2021 School Year
 - o New literacy curriculum w/ leveled interventions
 - o New Pre-k and Kindergarten curriculum
 - o New SEL curriculum
 - o Revamped PBIS program
 - Hired a Literacy Specialist/Coach w/ extensive experience and knowledge of Wonders Curriculum. She works with staff and students with the highest need.
 - o 2 Full time and 2 part time Title 1 teachers so all students who qualify for Title services are being served
 - Full time school counselor and 1 intern as well as City
 Connects to address students' social and emotional needs

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- o Reading Corps
- o UWRF and UST tutors
- o Hoping to offer Saturday school at some point
- o Purchased IXL, Vooks, Epic, and Seesaw for additional literacy support
- o All students are 1:1 w/ technology
