 - Consequences of unexcused absences

- Discussed needs for all students: those who have chronic absences and those that are here consistently and whose needs are not being met due to teachers reteaching
- Would summer school be a benefit for students who have missed a lot of school? Cost prohibitive
- Policy would start for the 2022-23 school year
- Will still have the retention conversation with families as needed this year
- 6. Finance Committee Report Katie
 - o Committee did not meet today but will meet next month
 - Leah and Dawn will meet soon to discuss next year's budget. Budget should have a start for the next board meeting.
- 7. Executive Director's Report Leah
 - o Enrollment is at 190
 - o Attendance is 83% (daily average for the whole year)
 - o NWEA data will be used to set goals with the Guild for next year
 - o MCA testing is ready to begin
 - o 6th grade Sexual Health presentation is still being planned
 - o TEacher observations will be finished by May
 - o 1 para was released. Position will not be filled this year.
 - o Kou did a walk through and took photos of pictures that need repair: building and playground. Discussed current lease aid and how to negotiate with the church: safety issues, reasonable rent, benefits of LIFE Prep being in this building. Kou's recommendation is to get out (even to start now). Moving areas/neighborhoods could also attract new families. Also discussed taking 100 families as a core to start with and move to "start over." Kou will call OSHA to discuss the quality/safety of the playground (useful as rent negotiation leverage).
 - o Mold finally repaired (painted) that was requested in August.
 - o Choir performed at Timberwolves game and was a success.
 - Team Smile has reached out to see if we would be interested in 2nd set of dental care on May 18.
